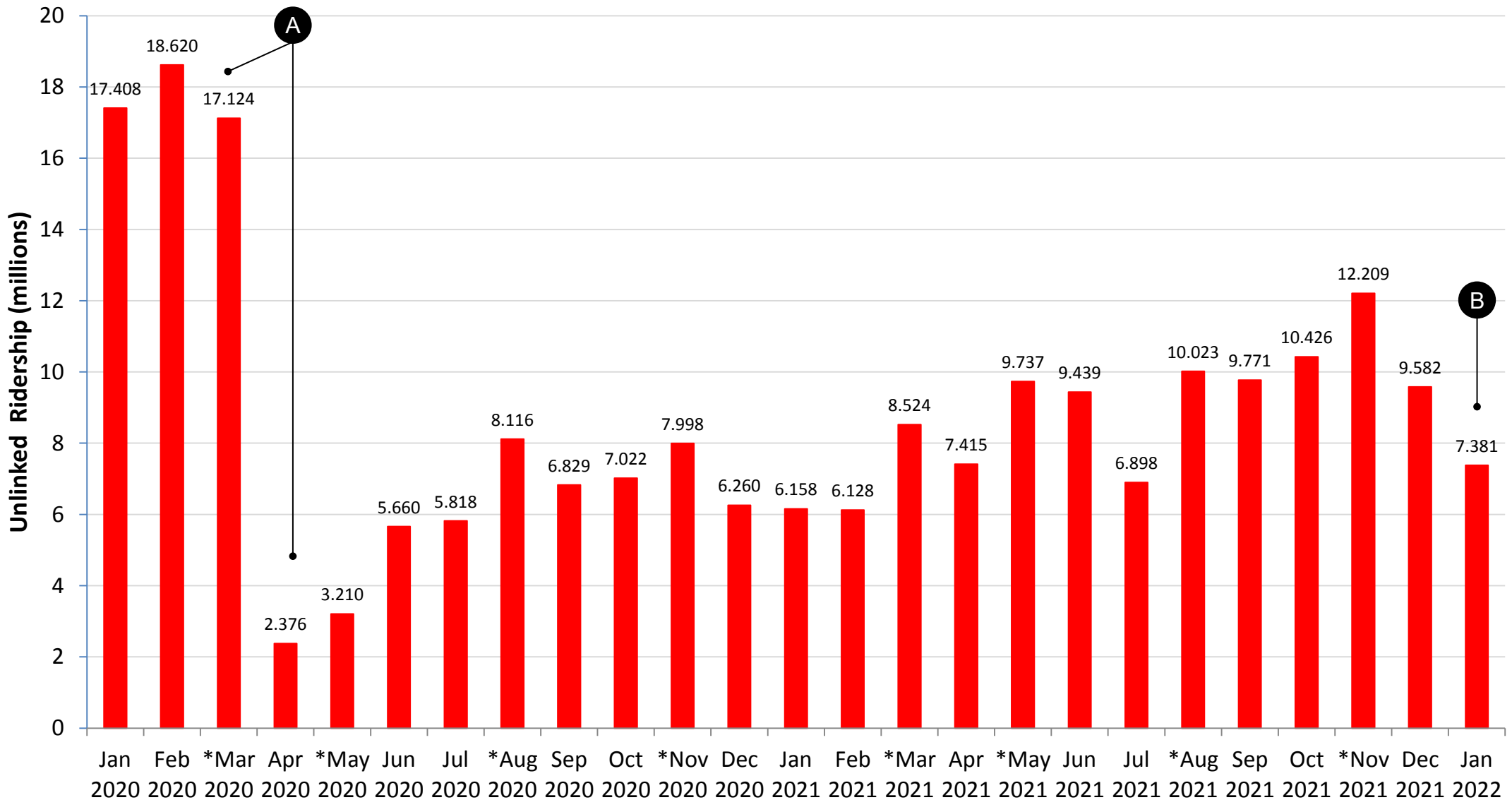


SEPTA Unlinked City Ridership from January 2020 to January 2022



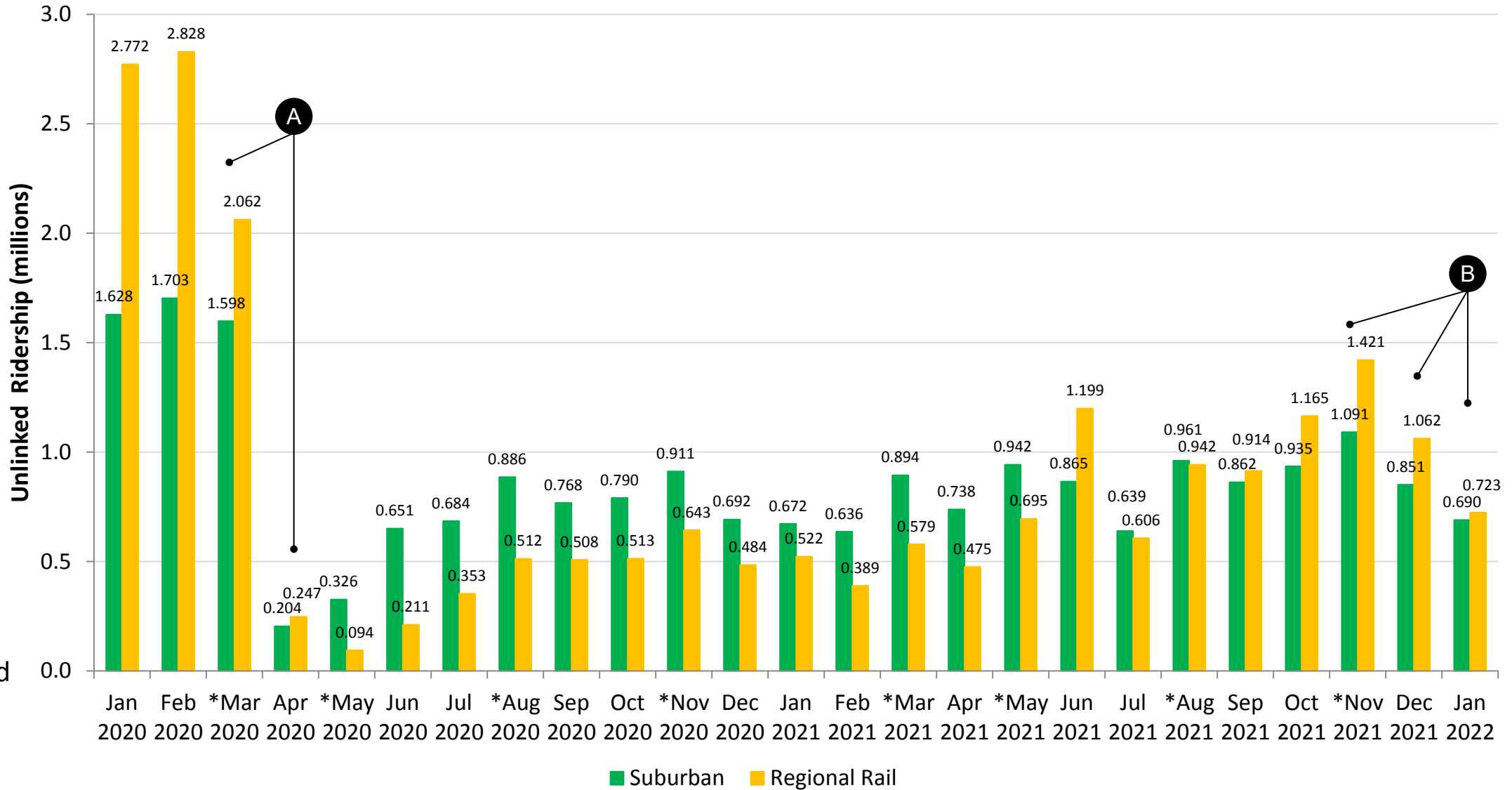
A Comparing Apr 2020 to Mar 2020, City ridership dropped 86%, from 17.1 to 2.4 million.

B City ridership in Jan 2022 about 7.4 million, which is above Jan 2021 levels of 6.2 million, but still well below pre-COVID levels in Jan 2020 at 17.4 million.

SEPTA Unlinked Suburban and Regional Rail Ridership from January 2020 to January 2022



A Comparing Apr 2020 to Mar 2020, Suburban and Regional Rail ridership dropped 87% and 88%, respectively.

B Suburban and Regional rail ridership dropped two consecutive months in Dec 2021 and Jan 2022 compared to Nov 2021, and Jan 2022 still well below pre-COVID levels.

SEPTA Percent Change in Ridership Compared to 2019 Baseline

A Significant drop in ridership in Apr 2020 for all transit types with City and Suburban down 88%, and Regional Rail down by 91%.

B City and Suburban ridership in Jan 2022 still down 58% and 57%, respectively, and Regional Rail down 73%, compared to the same months in 2019 and pre-pandemic conditions.
