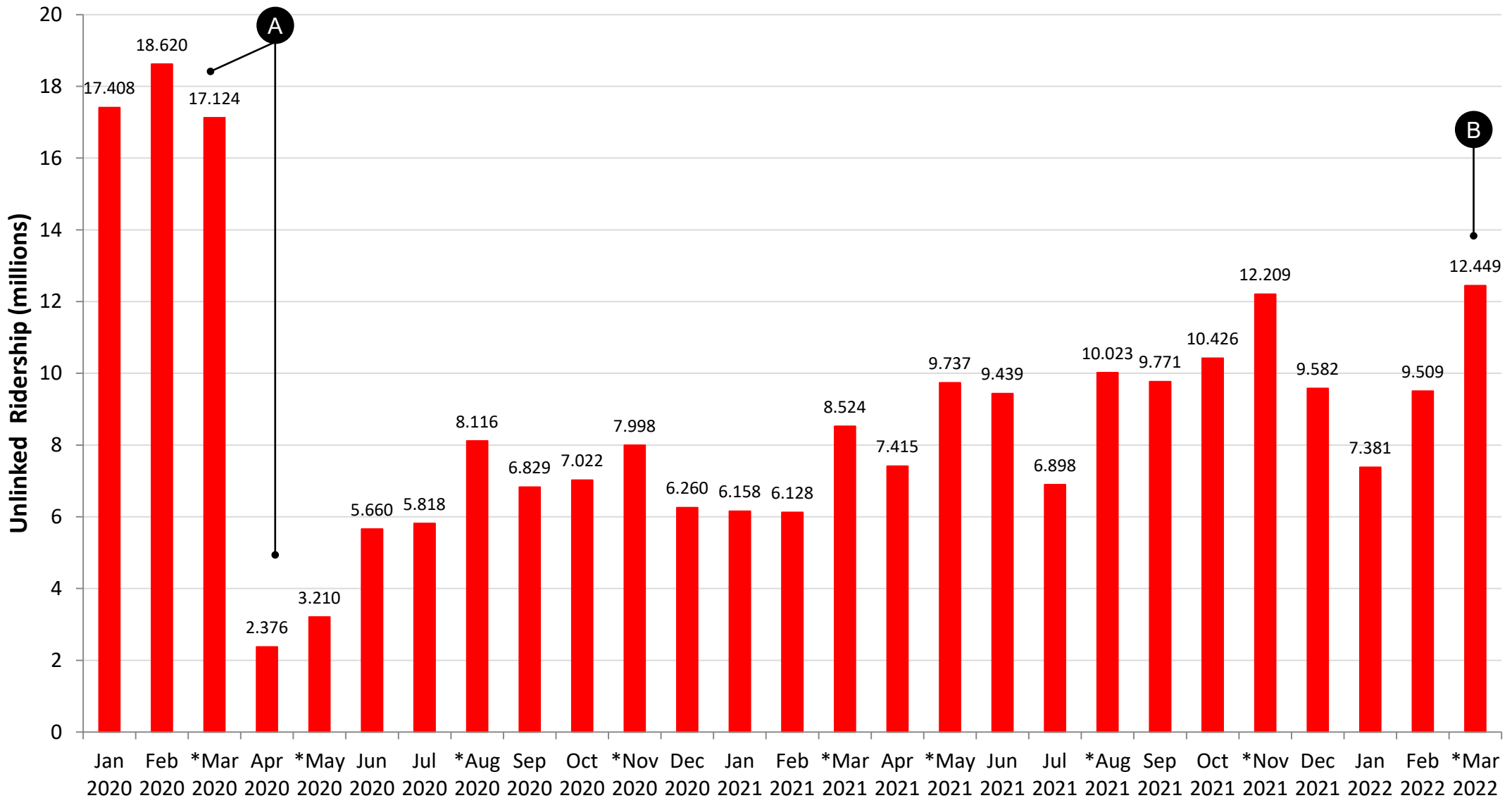


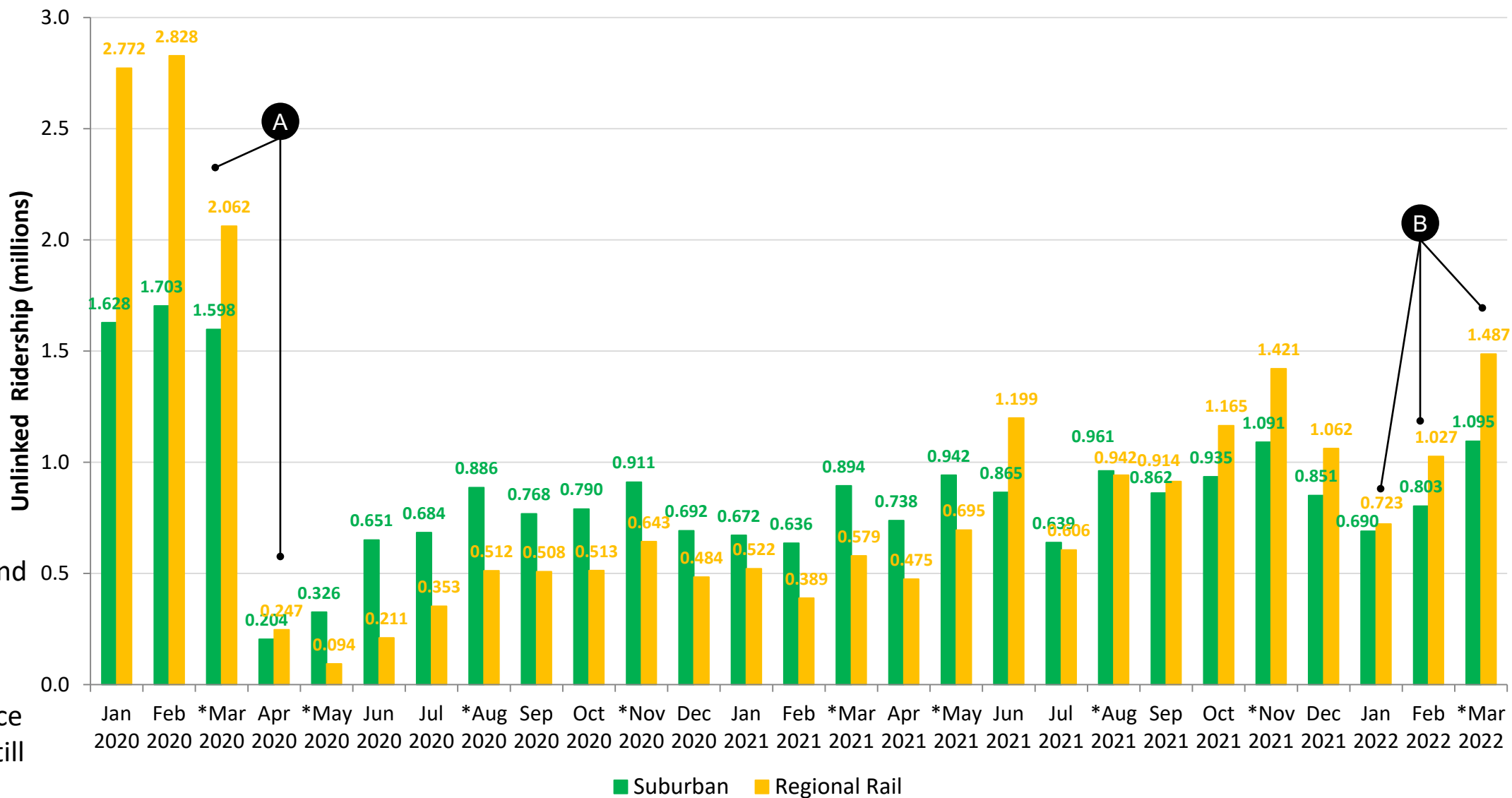
SEPTA Unlinked City Ridership from January 2020 to March 2022



A Comparing Apr 2020 to Mar 2020, City ridership dropped 86%, from 17.1 to 2.4 million.

B City ridership in Mar 2022 is about 12.45 million, which is at its highest level since Mar 2020, but still well below pre-COVID levels.

SEPTA Unlinked Suburban and Regional Rail Ridership from January 2020 to March 2022



A Comparing Apr 2020 to Mar 2020, Suburban and Regional Rail ridership dropped 87% and 88%, respectively.

B Suburban and Regional Rail ridership increased in consecutive months in Feb and Mar 2022 from the prior month and both at highest level since Mar 2020, but still well below pre-COVID levels.

SEPTA Percent Change in Ridership Compared to 2019 Baseline



A Significant drop in ridership in Apr 2020 for all transit types with City and Suburban down 88%, and Regional Rail down by 91%.

B City, Suburban and Regional Rail ridership down 48%, 49% and 56%, respectively compared to the same months in 2019.
